**RE:** State of Emergency & Temporary COVID-19 Measures

As you are likely aware, the Province of Alberta has declared a state of public health emergency. New <u>temporary measures</u> to reduce the transmission of COVID-19 and protect the health care system came into effect this morning.

## As well, starting Monday, September 20, businesses must follow one of two options:

**1.** Implement the <u>Restrictions Exemption Program</u> requiring proof of vaccination or negative rapid test result to continue operating as usual. Customers will need to be checked for government-issued proof of vaccination or a recent negative COVID-19 test.

The requirement for proof of vaccination or negative rapid test does not apply to your employees. That is a decision that is up to you as an employer.

OR

- 2. Follow capacity and operating restrictions if you choose not to require proof of vaccination. This allows you to remain open and operating as usual, as long as you implement the following requirements:
  - social distancing of 2 metres
  - mask wearing (employees and customers)
  - only one third of your fire code capacity for your depot/place of business
  - customers must be from one household or two close contacts for those living alone
  - working from home unless a physical presence is required for operational effectiveness (such as depots and the CSA plants, where working from home is not possible)
